Bartram's book *Travels* recorded detailed observations of plants, animals, landscapes, and Native American cultures across the Southeast, including South Carolina. His work provided some of the

earliest scientific descriptions of the region's natural environment and society and helped introduce the ecology and geography of the American South to scholars and readers in Europe and the United States.

Demolition and storm drainage installation continued this week on Grey Street. Demolition of Main Street in between Lucky Street and Retreat Steet is scheduled to start Monday, March 16, 2026. While the portion of Main Street will be closed, the sidewalk for the local businesses along this section will remain open. Attached is a design rendering of the project area along with the construction schedule which was updated today. The construction schedule will be updated every second week.

AMW Construction (the contractor for the concession stand/bathroom) once again made impressive progress framing the concession stand this week, as scheduled. The siding, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical rough-ins continued this week.

SCIIP Sewer Improvements Phase I - The project is completed.

SCIIP Sewer Improvements Phase II

LW has begun construction on the Lower section of Line "C" next week. Demolition of old manholes on the Line "A" still pending – same report as last week.

Lucky Street, James Street, and Highland Avenue Water Improvements

On March 10, 2026, the City Council awarded the construction bid for this project to J&M Construction. Contract execution and insurance documents were initiated this week along with some equipment mobilization.

Electric Undergrounding Project

The contract has been awarded to UPA, material has been delivered. Construction is underway.

SCADA Upgrade Project

On March 10, 2026, the City Council awarded the construction bid for this project to ICS Automated. Contract execution and insurance documents were initiated this week. A schedule will be provided in a future report.

Unity Tank Upgrade

The Unity Tank project is being funded through the South Carolina Rural Infrastructure Authority (SC RIA) and the City's 2025 Combined Utility System Bond. The City Attorney is currently working to complete the land acquisition, while the project engineer is advancing the tank design and site layout.

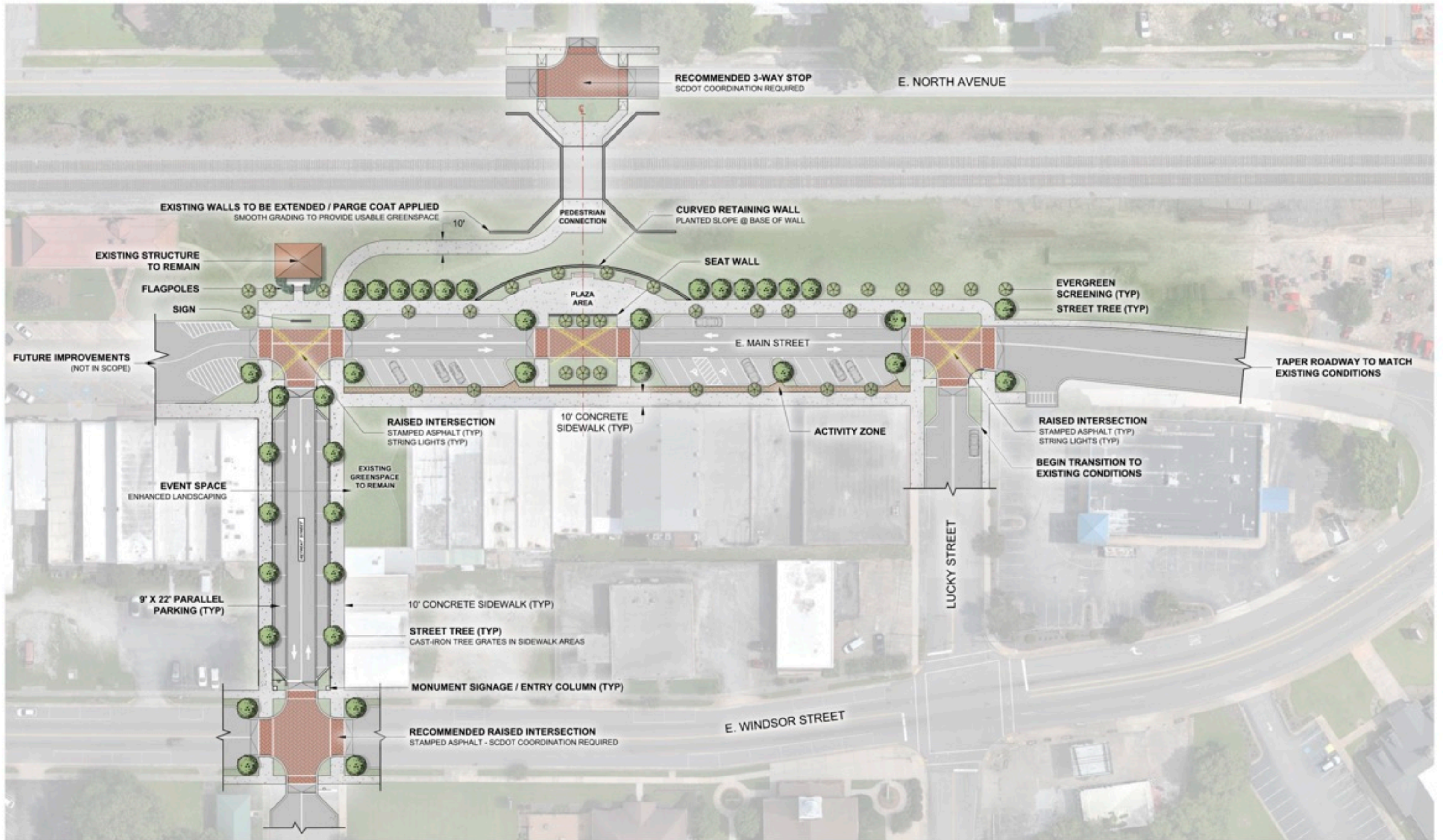

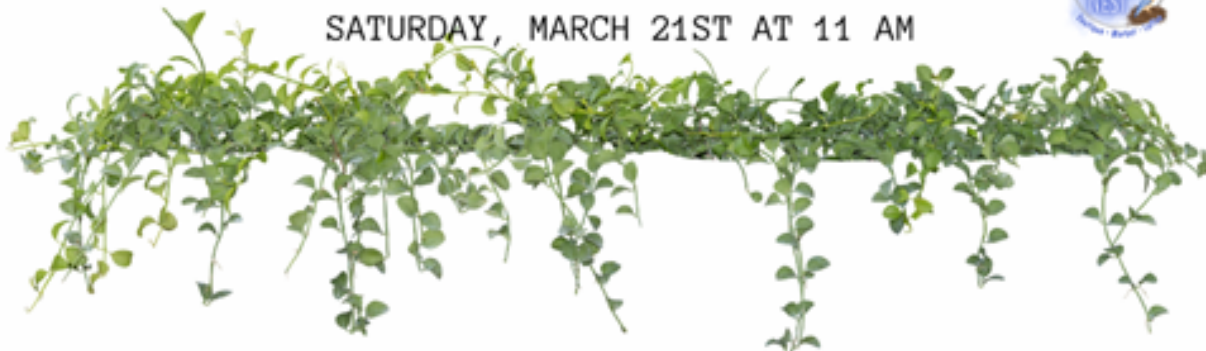
