Questions Received Before July 7th, 2026 (Answers)

- Will a sample COI be acceptable for the bid package?
 - Yes, We will need a COI showing the City of Westminster's name.
- What is meant by "Project Timeline and Substantial Completion" since the RFP is for on-call services?
 - This is just part of our Standard Bid Package and doesn't apply in this situation.
- Is the Bid Bond necessary for the RFP since is for on-call services? If yes, then how would that amount be calculated?
 - No this isn't needed as a COI will be sufficient.
- Will the South Carolina Certificate of Authorization substitute for the required contractor license?
 - Yes. For this solicitation, a South Carolina Certificate of Authorization (COA) issued by the South Carolina Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors is acceptable in lieu of a South Carolina contractor's license, provided the proposer is offering professional engineering and construction materials testing services within the scope of its authorization. The successful proposer must possess all licenses, certifications, and accreditations required by South Carolina law to perform the services specified in this RFP.
- Can you confirm whether the solicitation was intended to be issued as a bid package or if the intent was to solicit qualifications and fee schedules for professional CMT/SI services to support future City projects?
 - Both, we need unit prices for different services for future and for the current project.
